

**Mid-Winter Meeting

March 23, 24, 2018**

GLASMC Mid-Winter Presidents Meeting was opened without fanfare and plenty of lubrication as would be expected at a Motor Corp event. The President Sam Wood thanked everyone for attending and announced the activities for Saturday.

Following the Saturday meeting a bus will take everyone to the Shrine Club for lunch then on to Labatt's brewery and return around 4:00 p.m.

The minutes from the Fall Ceremonial were distributed for review. A motion was made to accept minutes as distributed. The motion was seconded and approved

The audit committee of CJ Apel and Geoff Clays thoroughly reviewed the financial report and supporting documentation presented by Bruce James, Treasurer. (Still trying to figure out how they did it in the dark) The Committee reported that the financial report and documentation were in good order and recommended they be approved as audited. The motion was seconded and approved.

There was additional discussion regarding individual competition that would be brought up at the meeting on Saturday.

President Wood adjourned the meeting as everyone ran out of lubrication.

Saturday March 24, 2018

President Sam Wood called the meeting to order with a prayer and the Shrine Pledge. It was apparent not everyone was mentally there or awake, but he chose to press on.

The usual order of business was followed, I think, with a report of the Presidents meeting and approval of the minutes from the Fall Ceremonial and Audit report.

The report about individual competition was presented. Discussion ensued about individual competition. Motion was made to allow individual drive-in competition for non-team individual events. The motion was seconded for discussion. The events will be for individuals in the Multi-Wheel Obstacle Course, 2-Wheel Obstacle Course and 2-Wheel Slow Ride. They will correspond to the current classification and be eligible for trophies based on an "Individual" within that classification along with the award of Fastest on Four Wheels, Fastest on Two Wheels and added to the by-laws, Slowest on Two Wheels. The motion was approved to be sent to the members for final vote at the September meeting. As it is a By-Laws change to Article VIII it must be approved by a 2/3rds majority of voting members to become valid.

Any individual Noble who wishes to participate in slow ride and or Obstacle course who is not part of a competing team must pay the prescribed fee for membership dues, sign any applicable waiver follow all applicable competition rules and regulations and submit to a courtesy

inspection of the vehicle to be used in the drive-in competition before being allowed to participate in the event.

President Wood called for discussion on allowing a person to make a second run in obstacle course and slow ride competition.

A motion to change the Competition Regulations to allow a rider to choose to make a second run in the obstacle course and or slow ride was made and seconded. The rider must make the decision at the stop box. If the rider decides to run again the first run immediately becomes null and void. Once the decision is made it is final and the rider moves to the end of the line for the second run. If the rider is disqualified on his first attempt he may run a second time. The motion was approved to be presented at the fall meeting and can be adopted by majority vote.

There was some discussion on the whereabouts of the ashtrays and humidors the were being used for fund raising. If anyone has any information, please let President Sam Wood or the other officers know.
